TRAP

Badgers can be cage trapped under licence for injection with a BCG vaccine

BadgerBCG is a licensed veterinary medicine. The vaccine cannot cause TB infection and vaccinated badgers do not excrete BCG.



TRAP

- Vaccination can contribute to herd immunity in badger social groups so not every badger needs to be vaccinated
- Even in areas where culling has taken place in England, badgers can be trapped in large numbers to achieve high vaccine coverage



INJECT

- Vaccination reduces the risk of a badger getting TB by up to 76%
- When over a third of adults are vaccinated, cubs within the social group are 79% less likely to be infected with TB
- Vaccinated badgers that do become infected get fewer and less severe lesions and excrete less bacteria, so pose less of a risk to cattle



PROTECT

- Yearly vaccination will reduce TB in badger populations and helps keep uninfected badgers free of TB
- Fewer infected badgers can only be a good thing for your cattle, reducing their potential exposure to the disease
